Madhur Anand, Professor and University Research Chair in Sustainability Science, School of Environmental Sciences, University of Guelph

Ecological Justice and the case of the bistable forest-grassland mosaics of Brazil and old-growth forests of Northern Ontario

Prof. Anand will reflect on the theme of ecological justice through a consideration of the endangered Atlantic forests and Campos grassland mosaics of southern Brazil and the endangered old-growth red pine forests in Northern Ontario. Touching on the issues of local and national governance and human values, she will show how ecological theory — such as the species-area relationship and eco-mathematical bistability, and ecological science in general — can contribute to a more nuanced understanding (and ultimately, a stronger conception) of ecological justice.
